

FEDERAL FINANCIAL AID

Federal and State Financial Assistance Programs

Tulsa Tech participates in the Federal Pell Grant Program, Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant Program, Federal Work Study Program and the Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant Program. The Department of Education Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) must be filed in order to determine applicant eligibility for any of these programs.

To be considered for the Oklahoma Tuition Aid Grant, applicants must be residents of Oklahoma and have an Expected Family Contribution (EFC) of 1700 or less. Since these funds are limited, applicants should apply as early in the calendar year as possible.

Tulsa Tech offers Federal Work-Study for eligible students with financial need. To be eligible for a Work Study position, students must be enrolled in a career major approved by the US Department of Education and must have a FAFSA on file with the US Department of Education showing financial need after consideration of cost of attendance and other financial assistance. Students must contact Financial Assistance to determine eligibility. If eligible, they must then formally apply for employment through HR. All selected applicants must complete Tulsa Tech's employment requirements and meet on-going performance requirements.

The FAFSA may be completed on-line via the web at www.fafsa.ed.gov. **Tulsa Tech's school code is 012572.** Complete the 2011-2012 FAFSA if you will be enrolled between July 1, 2011 and June 30, 2012. Applications should be submitted as soon as possible. US Department of Education will notify applicants of their eligibility. Tulsa Tech will send a letter informing Pell eligible applicants of next steps. *Tulsa Tech does not participate in the Stafford Loan, Plus or Perkins Loan programs.*
